Ingredients:

Optional:

250g clear honey

225g unsalted butter

3 large eggs, beaten

1 tsp mixed spice

For the icing:

hot water

55g icing sugar

1 tbsp clear honey

¹/₂ tsp ground ginger

or ground cinnamon

300g self-raising flour

100g dark muscovado sugar

Easter Recipe - Traditional Honey Cake - Racheal Anderson, Mary Sumner House

Method

Heat oven to 180C/160C fan/gas 4. Butter and line a 900g loaf tin with baking parchment.

- Cut the butter into pieces and drop into a medium pan with the honey and sugar. Melt slowly over a low heat. When the mixture to turn to liquid, increase the heat under the pan and boil for about one minute. Leave to cool for 15-20 minutes, to prevent the eggs cooking when they are mixed in.
- Beat the eggs into the melted honey mixture using a wooden spoon. Sift the flour and spices, if using, into a large bowl and pour in the egg and honey mixture, beating until you have a smooth, quite runny batter.
- Pour the mixture into the tin and bake for 40 minutes-1 hour until the cake is well-risen, golden brown and springs back when pressed. A skewer pushed into the centre of the cake should come out clean.
- While the cake is still warm, make the icing by mixing the sugar and honey together with 2-3 teaspoons of hot water. Trickle over the cake in whatever design takes your fancy.
