- The theme for this year's 16 Days is 'No more 1 in 3' referring to the number of women affected by domestic abuse.
- On-line Morning Prayer on first day (25th Nov) and Evening Prayer on final day (10th Dec).
- On-line mid-day prayers for the 16 days with 16 guest speakers from around the world.

- Mothers' Union Global Day is on Saturday the 5th of December.
