A delegation of Mothers' Union representatives, attended the UN's Commission on the Status of Women in New York to lobby at a very practical level on behalf of economic empowerment for rural women and girls.

Rural areas remain at an economic disadvantage, compared to their urban counterparts, with 80% of undernourished people in the world living in rural communities.

Whilst rural women produce more than 55 per cent of all food grown in developing countries they are less likely to own the land they farm.

The lack of economic empowerment; inequalities in accessing education and skills training; decent paid work; as well as discrimination within the workplace and the global gender gap in income and employment, which currently stands at 59% mean that **women bear the brunt of poverty**.

Children's Alliance Report Card

The Irish Government received an overall 'C-' grade in Report Card 2018, reflecting a satisfactory attempt, with children still left wanting.

The highest individual grade is a 'B' for 'Child Protection', with the lowest grade being awarded for 'Child and Family Homelessness', receiving an 'E', unchanged since last year. A barely acceptable performance, with little or no positive impact on children was noted in regard to 'Traveller and Roma Children'; 'Refugee and Asylum-Seeking Children'; Important groundwork has been carried out in a number of areas, but it is clear that much more has be done.

It is a once-in-a-generation opportunity to make sure survivors and their children get the support they need, and some aspects of the bill warrant careful consideration.
